I submitted my public comment regarding application MLDFY2024-0001 on your website, but I wanted to email it as well to make sure it was received. If it was received, please disregard this email.

I have concern regarding the trees along the northeast drainage ditch on the Boise Bible College property, 8695 W. Marigold. These trees are located behind my property, as well as my neighbors'. We are located in the Bentwood Subdivision on N. Willowdale Lane. I am specifically concerned about the mature willow tree, but all of the trees are important to the neighborhood. I am unsure if any construction or tiling of the ditch will impact the trees, or if there is a plan to remove them, that is the reason for my comments.

I urge all to consider the significant ecological and aesthetic value of these trees before making a final decision. The trees in question are not only a stunning visual asset but also serves several important functions that contribute to the quality of life in our neighborhood:

1. ****Aesthetic Beauty****: The trees are a picturesque element of our landscape.
