

2018 Annual Report

Dear Citizens,

It is with great pleasure that I serve as “YOUR” Chief of Police and present the 2018 annual report for the Garden City Police Department. During 2018, your Garden City Police Department employed 26 full-time police officers, three part-time police officers, six full-time civilian support personnel, and one full-time victim witness coordinator. It should be noted that during the last quarter of 2018, the Garden City Police Department experienced a significant number of injuries and/or serious illnesses that resulted in a loss equivalent to 3 full-time sworn police officers. Those losses continued through the first half of 2019.

2018 DEPARTMENT MANAGEMENT

Our team worked diligently to continue to improve and maintain a professional organizational culture and maximize the efficiencies within our Department. I am extremely proud of our Department as we continue to emphasize organizational pride and member-retention by utilizing a management philosophy that embraces:

- Empowerment
- “One Department-One Team” Philosophy
- Professionalism through Accountability

We have 36 members of the organization “Committed to S.E.R.V.I.C.E” and dedicated to making Garden City a safe place for everyone.

2018 CRIME REPORT

During 2018, your police department was extremely busy responding to crime reports and fostering relationships within our community. We responded to 18,667 calls for service, generated 3,222 police reports, of which 1,391 of those offenses were reported to the National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS). Of the offenses/reports tracked by NIBRS, 777 resulted in arrest.

Crimes: In 2017 we experienced a 9.43 % drop in offenses reported to NIBRS, however in 2018 we observed a 15.82% increase. The vast majority of the increase can be attributed to the 34.6% increase we experienced in Crimes Against Society, also known drug crimes. The vast majority of the drug related crimes are a result of officer-initiated activity and contacts, i.e. traffic stops. In addition, your Garden City Police Department worked very hard to solve reported crimes, boasting the highest clearance rate (54.85%) amongst all police departments in Ada County.

Arrests: We also experienced an increase in total arrests (8.98%). The increase in arrests would be expected considering the increase in crime and the Department’s high clearance rate. The Department continues to promote the best practices outlined in *National Justice Reform*, which encourages the pre-sentence incarceration of only those offenders who are deemed a risk to society.

2018 TRAFFIC

Accidents: Garden City Police Department responded to 320 traffic collisions (5% decrease in comparison to 2017). We deployed a two-officer STEP/Motor team, which targeted hazardous moving violations that could result in collisions. Lowering the traffic collisions in Garden City remains one of our Department’s priorities.

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Fatality Collisions: We responded to two collisions resulting in fatalities. One of the collisions involved an intoxicated pedestrian and the second was a result of a medical issue prior to the collision. In an attempt to minimize fatal and injury accidents in Garden City, we will continue to execute a three-pronged approach (enforcement, engineering, and education).

Citations: The Department conducted 4,182 traffic stops (8% increase over 2017) and issued 3,156 traffic citations.

Warnings: Our officers issued 2,235 traffic warnings. It should be noted that in many instances, violators commit multiple violations prior to the traffic stop.

2019 Goals

As we manage and prepare the Garden City Police Department to progress through 2019, we have prioritized several projects and established numerous organizational goals:


1. **Public Safety:** The safety of our community will always remain our highest priority and goal. In 2019 we will continue to employ, embrace, and emphasize the SE.R.V.I.C.E. we provide our community. We will continue to explore new ways to improve our methods, maximizing our growth and ensuring accountability for our actions.
2. **Employee Retention:** One of the top priorities of my administration has been, and will continue to be, retaining our highly qualified and top performing team members. Law enforcement nationwide is facing a serious hiring crisis. It has become very difficult to identify and hire good quality candidates, therefore retaining highly qualified loyal team members is critical. The Garden City Police Department is a great department and we serve a great community. Our department must strive to recruit, hire, and retain great officers and team members.
3. **Courageous Leadership:** We will emphasize “Courageous Leadership” with all of our supervisors and managers within the Department. “Do the right thing, for the right reasons, all of the time.” We will continually meet with, train, and support our supervisors during their quest to become great leaders.
4. **Physical Fitness Training Evaluations:** In 2016 we implemented mandatory physical fitness training for all of our officers. Although we are not at 100% compliance due to injuries, we will continue to emphasize physical fitness training with the goal of reaching 100% compliance.
5. **Leverage Personnel:** In 2018, we experienced a significant number of injuries/illnesses to sworn personnel. As we explore new ways to improve efficiencies, we will continue to utilize partnerships with other local law enforcement organizations in order to leverage/share personnel (i.e. Ada County Action Team, Ada Metro SWAT, ICAC and the US Marshal’s Taskforce).
6. **Succession Planning:** We are dedicated to providing professional development opportunities for team members in an attempt to prepare the future leaders of your Garden City Police Department.
7. **Community Partnerships:** The Department as a whole strives to maximize our community partnerships through sponsoring and actively participating in positive events throughout the community.

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8. **Department Branding:** In 2015-2016, the Garden City Police Department, with the assistance of the City Council and the citizens of Garden City, adopted new core values, a new mission statement, and a new SE.R.V.I.C.E. motto (Safety, Excellence, Respect, Valor, Integrity, Community, and Empathy). We have embraced our SE.R.V.I.C.E. model and have incorporated it into our daily work and deployment philosophy.

It is my honor to serve as your Chief of Police for the Garden City Police Department. "YOUR" police department is an extremely busy department and we are proud to serve you. It is our goal to protect our great community and its citizens, while providing the best possible law enforcement "S.E.R.V.I.C.E.".


Garden City Police Department 2018-19 Organizational Chart







Total Number of Crimes




Violent Crimes










