## **Police Make Arrest in Burglary Investigation**

**Garden City, Idaho** – Garden City Police arrested Jason Daniels (30yoa) of Boise and Amanda Peden (37yoa) of Garden City on numerous charges related to a burglary investigation.

**Details:** On November 1, 2020, Garden City police officers on routine patrol discovered property from the Audio Lab located in the 3600 block of Osage. Officers checked the building, which was locked and attempted to contact the owner. Officers later met with the victim and learned that approximately \$35,000 worth of musical instruments/equipment and tools had been taken during the burglary.

Garden City Police detectives began investigating the crime, and eventually received a lead as to the whereabouts of the missing property. On the morning of November 4, 2020, at around 11:00 AM, Garden City detectives contacted Amanda Peden and Jason Daniels at a residence in the 400 block of East 40<sup>th</sup> Street. Upon contacting Peden and Daniels, officers found that the missing property from the burglary was in their possession. At the time of the contact both Peden and Daniels had outstanding warrants for their arrest.

Peden and Daniels were arrested without incident and booked into the Ada County Jail for the following charges. They will be arraigned in Magistrates Court on November 5<sup>th</sup>, 2020.

Jason Daniels:

- Possession of Stolen Property (Felony)
- Probation Violation Agents Warrant (Felony)

Amanda Peden:

- Possession of Stolen Property (Felony)
- Probation Violation Warrant (Felony)
- Warrant with Underlying Charges of:
  - Burglary (Felony)
  - Grand Theft (Felony)
  - Petit Theft X 4 (Misdemeanor)
  - Commercial Burglary (Misdemeanor)

Lt. Tom Patterson said, “The case investigators were excited to be able to return most of the missing property to the victim so quickly. Much of the property had great sentimental value to the victim, which made them irreplaceable. This case is a great example of the police working with the victim to bring the case to a successful conclusion. This is completely in line with our department motto of “S.E.R.V.I.C.E.”
