THIS MATTER, came before the Garden City Design Review Committee for consideration on March 1, 2021, April 5, 2021, April 19, 2021, May 3, 2021, June 7, 2021, and February 7, 2022. The Design Review Committee reviewed the application and materials submitted. Based on the evidence presented, pursuant to Garden City Code Table 8-6A-1, the Design Review Committee makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Decision:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The application is for a design review for a structural addition to an existing building. The addition is less than 25% of the gross floor area of the existing structure.
2. The applicant is Joe Turner.
3. The property owner of record is Western HVAC Properties LLC.
4. The location of the project is:

7. The design review application is for the structural addition to an existing building used by a service provider. The scope of the design review is limited to the entire property.

- d. Mark Gier provided rebuttal:
 - i. The plaza as proposed is more than 500 square feet.
 - ii. Placement of the plaza is to help meet the frontage requirements along Bradley Street.
 - iii. The expansion is limited to the southern portion of the property in that the nature of the expansion is to increase the existing warehouse size.
 - iv. Sign for Western Heating and Air is a conflict with the potential plaza placement along the north western property corner.
- e. Public Testimony was closed.
- f. Discussion included:
 - i. Lot line adjustment and/or consolidation would need to create parcels that could act as stand-alone properties in the instance that one was to be sold.
 - ii. Because of the intensification of the use, not addressing the pedestrian access on Fenton Street is detrimental to the health and welfare of the public, especially bicyclists and pedestrians.
 - iii. The façade along Fenton Street needs to create a comfortable atmosphere for pedestrians through the use of fenestrations and landscaping. Pedestrian oriented façade features are required.
 - iv. Fenton Street can be treated as an extension of Osage.
 - v. Clustering of street trees along eastern side of the site adjacent to Fenton.
 - vi. The western portion of Fenton Street where it connects with Bradley street is to have landscaping and sidewalks.
 - vii. At least 15% fenestration along street side fronts are required.
 - viii. If streetlight is installed to Garden City standards, there is a request form that can be filled out for the city to adopt the new streetlight.
 - ix. Loading zone area is a safety concern.
 - x. If pedestrian sidewalk is created along Fenton street, then pathway through the site is not required as stated in the drafted conditions.
 - xi. Fences cannot be along the property line adjacent to Fenton. Not only does it make for a code compliance issue, but conflicts with the Transportation Needs List vision of Osage and Stockton, to which this section of Fenton is allowed to be treated as.
 - xii. Landscape treatment to soften the minimum 5' setback area between the proposed expansion and N. Fenton Street.
- g. Committee member Labrie approved moved to continue the application to the date certain on June 7, 2021.
- h. Committee member Gresham seconded.
- i. The motion carried unanimously.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Design Review Committee reviewed the application with regard to Garden City Code, Title 8, Chapter 4, and based on the conditions required herein, concludes the application **meets/ does not meet** the standards of approval under **GCC 8-6B-3 Design Review Committee**.

DECISION

WHEREFORE, based upon the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law contained herein, the Design Review Committee hereby **APPROVES/DENIES** the application, subject to the following conditions:

POTENTIAL CONDITIONS FOR APPROVAL DECISION

Site Specific Requirements:

Scope of the Permit:

1. The scope of the permit is to allow for the structural addition to the existing Western Heating and Air building.
2. **Waivers to Garden City Code, Title 8 regulations include:**
 - a. **Sidewalk Waiver**
3. **RECOMMENDATION:** As of the date of this writing, the Federal Emergency Management Agency has issued Draft Digital Federal Insurance Rate Maps (DFIRM) which proposes to delineate the subject properties to be within the 100- year Floodplain. The applicant should consider that any new structures must have the top of the lowest floor at or above BFE (as defined by adopted FIRM) pursuant to current Garden City Code. Stricter standards may be required in the future for building permit approval.

Commented [HV1]: Conflicts with condition #9 under Prior to Occupancy. The Design Review Committee will need to determine if a sidewalk waiver is approved, or if a sidewalk shall be installed.

Prior to Construction:

1. A lot line consolidation or adjustment shall be approved by staff for lots 6, 7, and 8, tax parcels R1057230065, R1057230070 & R1057230075.
2. The entrance and exit drives shall be code conforming and designed to prevent traffic hazards and nuisances.
3. No structure, facility, drive lane, parking area, or loading area shall be located adjacent to a residential district.
4. The site and Fenton must be constructed so as to make it obvious that Fenton is a public right-of-way for the use of public.
5. A sustainable development checklist document shall be submitted, and the application must be found in conformance with GCC 8-4G.

Prior to Occupancy:

1. Occupancy of the addition space shall not commence until after a Certificate of Occupancy has been obtained from Garden City Development Services Department.
2. A building permit shall be applied for and approved by Garden City Development Services Department.
3. Bicycle parking facilities shall be provided consistent with the location and the design standards of GCC 8-4D-3.

- a. The property is required to have at least two bicycle parking spots.
4. Any existing chain-link fence, chain-link with slats fence, barbed wire fence, or any other prohibited fencing materials according to GCC 8-4A-3 shall be removed and replaced with code compliant fencing materials.
5. All proposed fencing shall be compliant with the standards set forth in GCC 8-4A-3 Fences and Walls.
 - a. Fences greater than three and one-half feet (3.5') shall be set back to be flush or behind the building frontage.
 - i. The proposed 6ft tall fence along N. Fenton Street shall be setback to be flush with the building frontage
6. All trash enclosures shall be enclosed and compliant with GCC 8-4A-5 Outdoor Service and Equipment Areas.
7. All HVAC systems and mechanical units shall be built in compliance with GCC 8-4A-5 Outdoor and Service Equipment areas.
8. All Utilities shall be compliant with GCC 8-4A-8 Utilities.
9. A 5' wide detached sidewalk with landscape buffer shall be installed along all of N. Fenton Street as set forth in GCC 8-4E-6 Sidewalk standards.
10. One type B off street loading space shall be provided for and in compliance with GCC 8-4D-7.
 - a. The Loading zone shall be clearly marked with paint.
 - b. "No Parking" signage shall be present indicating that no parking shall occur within the loading zone.
11. A streetlight shall be installed in compliance with Garden City Streetlight Operations and Maintenance Policy.
12. The site and Fenton must be constructed so as to make it obvious that Fenton is a public right-of-way for the use of the public.
13. The Fenton right-of-way must either remain in its current configuration or it can be vacated if it connects to 50th Street.
14. The public's use of the Fenton right-of-way cannot be impeded by the use of the subject properties.
15. The site shall provide a landscape planting bed at least five feet (6') wide in front of the south elevation blank wall, with plant materials that obscure or screen at least fifty percent (50%) of the wall's surface within three (3) years.

Commented [HV2]: Conflicts with condition #2 under scope of permit. The Design Review Committee will need to determine if a sidewalk waiver is approved, or if a sidewalk shall be installed.

- a. Class II columnar trees shall be planted in the landscape buffer.

Site Specific Requirements for the Duration of the Use:

1. All Clear vision triangles must be maintained according to GCC 8-4E-3 Public Street Connections standards.
2. Site Layout: No structure, facility, drive lane, parking area, or loading area shall be located adjacent to a residential district.
3. Parking and Access:
 - a. The entrance and exit drives shall be designed to prevent traffic hazards and nuisances.
 - b. All surfaces used for parking shall be constructed with paving, vegetative cover or of dustless material.
4. The paved area between N. Fenton and the western façade of the existing structure shall not be used for parking unless vacation of that section of Fenton is obtained.
5. Limitations: The site shall not be used as vehicle wrecking as herein defined.
6. Site Maintenance:
 - a. All outdoor storage of materials or vehicles shall be maintained in an orderly manner so as not to create a public nuisance.
 - b. Stored items shall not block sidewalks or parking areas and may not impede vehicular or pedestrian traffic.
7. Other Standards Apply: Outdoor storage areas shall comply with section 8-1C-3, Property Maintenance Standards, of this title.
8. A shared parking agreement between all parcels that which are utilized or are planning on being utilized for parking by Western Heating and Air shall enter into a shared parking agreement and it shall be designated to the properties involved in the agreement, not the property owner(s).

General Requirements:

1. This review and approval is specific to the design of the project. Final approval is subject to the approval of other reviewing agencies. Any more restrictive standards adopted and made applicable by any Transportation Authority, Fire Authority or other Federal, State or Local regulatory agencies shall prevail. This approval shall not annul any portion of Garden City Code or other applicable regulation unless specifically noted.
2. Any changes to the plans and specifications upon which this approval is based, other than those required by the above conditions, will require submittal of an

application for modification and approval of that application prior to commencing any change.

3. All improvements and operations shall comply with applicable local, state and federal requirements and procedures whether specifically addressed in the analysis of this application or not. This shall include but not be limited to 8-4A General Provisions of Design and Development Regulations; 8-4I-3 and Landscape Maintenance Provisions 8-4I-9; and Standards for Transportation and Connectivity Provisions identified in 8-4E.
4. All utilities on the site, including telephone, cable television, and electrical systems shall be underground and in compliance with Garden City Code 8-4A-8.
5. Driveway openings in curbs shall comply with the requirements of the Transportation Authority. The driveway shall be straight or provide a 28-foot inside and 48-foot outside turning radius.
6. Plant materials which exhibit evidence of insect pests, disease, and/or damage shall be appropriately treated to correct the problem. Dead plant materials shall be replaced.
7. Where landscaping might impact motorist or pedestrian sight distance, shrubs shall be maintained below three feet (3') in height and trees shall be pruned so that the lowest branches will be at least seven feet (7') above the ground level.
8. A three-foot (3') clearance zone shall be maintained around the circumference of fire hydrants.
9. Retain and protect existing trees, vegetation, and native soils and integrate these features into the overall landscape plan as required by or exempted from Garden City Code 8-4I and as shown in the approved landscape plans.
10. Required landscape areas shall be at least seventy percent (70%) covered with vegetation at maturity, with mulch used under and around the plants. Use of mulch, organic or rock as the only ground cover in required planting areas is prohibited.
11. If trees are staked, the stakes shall be removed within twelve (12) months to prevent damage to the tree.
12. All planting areas that border driveways, parking lots, and other vehicle use areas shall be protected by curbing, wheel stops, or other approved protective devices.
13. Trees shall be planted at least three feet (3') from curbs, sidewalks, driveways and other hard surfaces to buffer from stress caused by vehicle overhang and compacted soils or planted with sufficient space to provide for the full maturity of the particular tree species.
14. All other plant material, except sod or ground cover, shall be set back a minimum of one foot (1') from any curb edge to protect from vehicle overhang and mechanical damage.
15. The landscape installation shall stabilize all soil and slopes.
16. All required landscaping shall be provided with an automatically controlled irrigation system in conformance with the best management practices for automatic irrigation systems.
17. Demonstrate compliance with or an exemption from Garden City Code 8-4G prior to certificate of occupancies.

18. This approval is for this application only. Additional permits, licenses and approvals may be necessary. All other applicable permits must be obtained prior to a Certificate of Occupancy.
19. Property Maintenance Standards shall be maintained as required by Garden City Code.
20. The property owner is responsible for the maintenance of all landscaping and screening devices required.
21. All outdoor living spaces must comply with Garden City Cod 8-3C General Provisions- Living Space Requirements.
22. All outdoor service and equipment areas shall comply with Garden City Cod 8-4A-5 Outdoor Service and Equipment Areas.
23. All stormwater systems must comply with Garden City Code 8-4A-7.
24. Materials submitted after the decision shall not be considered part of the record for this decision. If additional materials or information is submitted after the decision the application may be remanded to the decision-making body during which time the decision shall be stayed provided that there is no immediate threat to life or safety.
25. Any changes in the design, construction, operation or use shall be brought to the immediate attention of the Planning Official for determination if the changes are in substantial conformance with the City's action. Any modification to approved plans shall require submittal and approval of these modifications prior to construction. Final approval is based on substantial conformance with the plans reviewed and approved.
26. Any substantial changes to the design shall be reviewed by the Design Review Committee for compliance with Garden City Code 8-4. Any other changes that are not in substantial conformance with the approval shall be remanded to the decision-making body.
27. Occupying the site prior to Certificate of Occupancy is a criminal offense.
28. This approval shall expire 365 days from its approval, unless otherwise extended as allowed by Garden City Code .
29. There is a 15 day right to appeal to City Council. The applicant or any interested parties may appeal the decision or a part of the decision. An appeal shall be made on the form provided by the City and filed with the City Clerk within 15 days after the action of the decision.
30. If any term or provision of this decision, to any extent, is held invalid or unenforceable, the remaining terms and provisions hereof shall not be affected thereby, but each such remaining term and provision shall be valid and enforced to the fullest extent permitted by law.

STANDARD CONDITIONS FOR DENIAL DECISION

1. In order for approval by Garden City, the proposal must be in compliance with all standards of 8-6B-3. This project is not in compliance with 8-6B-3 standard(s) because it is not in compliance with the Garden City Comprehensive Plan Goals 2 and 4, the Future Land Use Designation of the Neighborhood Destination Node, and Garden City code sections 8-4C, 8-4D-7, 8-4E-6. Compliance can be met by providing the required sidewalk along Fenton Street, providing adequate pedestrian accessibility throughout the existing site, and providing a scale and form more align with the existing and planned neighborhood.
2. There is a 15 day right to appeal to City Council. An appeal shall be made on the form provided by the City and filed with the City Clerk within ten (10) days after the action of the decision.
3. Final decisions are subject to judicial review pursuant to The Local Land Use Planning Act, Chapter 65 Title 67 Idaho Code.
4. Any applicant or affected person seeking judicial review of compliance with the provisions of this section must first seek reconsideration of the final decision within fourteen (14) days. Such written request must identify specific deficiencies in the decision for which reconsideration is sought. Upon reconsideration, the decision may be affirmed, reversed or modified after compliance with applicable procedural standards. A written decision shall be provided to the applicant or affected person within sixty (60) days of receipt of the request for reconsideration or the request is deemed denied. A decision shall not be deemed final for purposes of judicial review unless the process required in this subsection has been followed. The twenty-eight (28) day time frame for seeking judicial review is tolled until the date of the written decision regarding reconsideration or the expiration of the sixty (60) day reconsideration period, whichever occurs first.
5. Pursuant to The Local Land Use Planning Act, Chapter 65 Title 67 Idaho Code, a takings analysis may be requested on final decisions.
6. If any term or provision of this decision, to any extent, is held invalid or unenforceable, the remaining terms and provisions hereof shall not be affected thereby, but each such remaining term and provision shall be valid and enforced to the fullest extent permitted by law.
